228/15 Apologies for absence

Apologies were received from Councillors Tassell, Smith and Croucher all with prior commitments.

229/15 Declarations of interest

Item 240/15 – Councillor Manning declared a non-pecuniary interest as he had requested the review

Item 236/15 F&GP - Precept - Councillor Manning declared a non-pecuniary interest as the leader of SCDC

230/15 Public forum (maximum 3 minutes per person, with an overall limit of 15 minutes) All parishioners wishing to speak and who are on the Electoral Register, must make their name known to the Clerk prior to the commencement of the meeting. Maximum of five people to speak. Large Groups must decide on a spokesperson representative The meeting was adjourned

Mr Francis asked the Council whether they could do anything about putting in cycle ways between Willingham and Rampton and Willingham and Over. He also raised concerns about the number and size of the potholes on the side of the West Fen Road outside the Pavilion.

The Chairman explained that although not ideal, there were alternative cycle ways to both destinations and as budgets were tight he couldn't see these being made a high priority. County Councillor Hudson also confirmed that they would incur a large cost and with budgets being cut the County would not consider the routes a high priority at the present time

With regards to the potholes, Councillor Cook confirmed the land was owned by County Council but that the parish had filled the holes in the past. He also reported that the slope of the parking area needed addressing. It was agreed to approach a local contractor to see if the area could be levelled to alleviate the problems.

The meeting was reconvened.

231/15 To approve the minutes of the Parish Council meeting held on the 4th November 2015

Councillor Law proposed the minutes be accepted as a true record of the meeting, seconded by Councillor Mellows and agreed with nine votes in favour and three abstentions due to not being at the meeting.

 $\underline{232/15}$ To deal with any matters arising from the meeting held on the 4th November not covered elsewhere on this agenda.

233/15 To receive and consider any County Council reports and communications not covered elsewhere on the agenda. County Councillor Hudson reported that the Ely Bus service was still on hold until budgets and bus plans had been agreed. The 30mph application for Station Road had been delayed until the New Year due to lack of resources in CCC. He had spoken to both the police and the County enforcement officer on several occasion regarding loose horses around the village.

Councillor Watson reported that there were still horses along Meadow Road and although on tethers they were extremely long and the horses were straying into the road. Councillor Hudson agreed to look into this. Councillor L King asked for an update regarding the future of the library and Councillor Hudson agreed to report back as soon as he heard anything.

234/15 To receive and consider any District Council reports and communications not covered elsewhere on the agenda. Councillor Manning reported that the Boundary Review consultation was running until January. Progress with Northstowe was very quiet at the moment. The recent Planning delegation system consultation had ended but as a result of feedback SCDC had agreed to look at this in the New Year.

Concerns were raised regarding security of the secondary school, once built it could be left to stand empty for around a year. Councillor Hudson confirmed that CCC were currently discussing this issue

235/15 Chairman's report including:

The chairman read out the latest information regarding superfast broadband. Information had been put on the website and passed to the library.

Notification of CAPALC annual general meeting

The meeting was to take place on the 10th December 2015. The Council would not be sending a representative on this occasion.

To receive notification from SCDC re community awards

The Chairman read out the categories for 2016 and noted that nominations needed to be submitted by the 15th January 2016. Councillor Watson proposed that Graham Smith, the village postman be put forward, seconded by Councillor Slater and **agreed** unanimously.

Notice had been received that the next Yesteryear Road Run would take place on the 24th April 2016. The group had requested the use of the Green and agreement to apply for road closures. It was agreed to confirm that the Council were happy with this.

Update from UK Power Networks regarding recent outages

The Chairman reported that he had received a response from UK Power Networks in relation to the concerns raised about the ongoing power failures in the village. UK Power had confirmed that the outages were predominantly due to two areas; one being trees interfering with power cables and the second being a lack of remote switching which allows for the isolation of the specific area affected. They had agreed to try and increase the tree maintenance and would look at whether it would be possible to install some automated switching.

Councillor Watson proposed the Council agree to the budget requests, seconded by Councillor Law and agreed with eleven votes in favour and one abstention.

Councillor Cook proposed that the Council set the precept demand at £115,000 as recommended by the F&GP Committee, seconded by Councillor Mellows and agreed with ten votes in favour and two abstentions.

Councillor Cook recommended that the Council increase the Clerk's pay scale to spinal point 38 with effect from 1st January 2016. They also recommended that the Council review the RFO and Litter picker's roles in the coming year with a view to a possible upgrade from January 2017. Concerns were raised about the current condition of the cemetery and Councillor Cook proposed that the Council ask the new contractors to come in during the next few weeks to bring the cemetery up to an acceptable standard ready for the next year's maintenance contract. This was seconded by Councillor Mellows and agreed unanimously.

Mr Papworth summarised the history regarding the boundary and the issues it's current siting causes to him and neighbouring properties. The boundary was due to be discussed by SCDC at a meeting in January and Mr Papworth asked the Council whether they would be willing to support the change.

Councillor Cook proposed that the Council write to SCDC (copying in Over Parish Council) confirming that they are in complete support of the proposal to move the boundary. This was seconded by Councillor Harris and agreed unanimously.

The meeting was reconvened.

Councillor L King summarised the response received from CCC regarding the proposed changes to the lighting in village. In essence the County had agreed to leave 3 lights on in areas highlighted by the PC in return for 3 other lights being switched off.
