Presentation from Kingswater Lindum regarding proposed development on Station Road

Chris Callahan of Kingswater Lindum presented their outline proposal for the development on Station Road. This would be for 22 all affordable houses. The development was on an exception site outside of the development area of the village. Concerns were raised regarding the volume of traffic on Station Road and the visibility at the entrance to the site. Mr Callahan confirmed they were aware of this and should the speed limit be reduced to 30mph as the Council were currently applying for, the visibility splay would need to be 43 metres either way from the centre of the

Mr Callahan also confirmed that although the ACRE survey had highlighted the need for 1 bedroom homes the plan did not include these as funding was not available for them.

Mr Callahan then went on to explain what the public consultation would involve and outlined the proposed programme timing for the project.

No questions were raised from the public

Presentation from CCC/SCDC regarding proposed development on Belsar Field

Stephen Conrad (CCC) explained the history around the site and stated that the proposal was being put forward by CCC in conjunction with the Housing Development Agency (HDA). The HDA was a joint enterprise between Cambridgeshire City and South Cambridgeshire District Council to work with public sector projects. It was hoped

that the development would generate income for CCC from the market led rental part of the scheme. The scheme was for 25 houses, 10 of which would be affordable.

Aldri Visagie and Nick Green then went on to explain the process that they had gone through so far and confirmed that they had spoken to planners, been through the design enabling process and liaised with SCDC regarding the housing mix needed. They had looked at other developments within the village and had endeavoured to design the site to fit in with a farm character.

The Committee Chair pointed out that both the Parish Council and SCDC had always objected strongly to any development North of Meadow Road. A brief discussion took place and it was agreed to write to SCDC to confirm the Council's reservations with regards to any development North of Meadow Road and to point out that SCDC planners had also objected in the past.

Stephen Conrad confirmed that the boards showing the development would be available to view in the library.

No questions were raised from the public.
