Report to Willingham Parish Council May 2017

Update

Despite a challenging year of losing considerable resource both the trustees and the remaining dedicated volunteers on the committee continue to fight for the development of the Youth Centre and are committed to hosting a range of activities in the forthcoming months.

Disappointingly, we worked hard throughout 2016 to recruit to a Youth Worker post but alas were unsuccessful, as were several our neighboring partners also finding themselves in similar situation.

As such we continued to focus on organizing fun and stimulating events in support of both the venue and the Youth Trust. These events were a huge successes within the local community and provided us with some much needed funds to secure the continuation of the Youth Centre as a great venue for the local community.

The accounts for the year end 16/17 are attached in Appendix 1.

Activities (for kids and fundraising)

- 1. Weekly bookings from a baby group Heartbeeps have continued and led to some private bookings.
- 2. The youth club is on hold until we can find a new Youth Worker.
- 3. There have been approximately 10 private bookings of the Youth Centre since last November.
- 4. The Youth Centre is also becoming a popular venue for other local agencies who rent out the venue approximately twice a month for private meetings.
- 5. During the last 12 months we have worked on three big fundraising events including; working in close partnership with WAG members to host the 2016 It's a Knock Out, which raised a little over £9,000 total being split between the Youth Centre and the playing field; the annual Willingham Feast Fall Family Disco was held in October and we hosted another in March, both were huge successes and local families came together to enjoy good fun, food and dancing, these between them raised some £800.00.

6. Finally, and more recently, over the last three months the Youth Trust worked in partnership with our local Co-Op in an amazing fund and awareness raising campaign. This was an amazing opportunity offered by the Co-Op to support local activities in raising funds to support their proposed venture. In our case, the funds will go towards Supervision, training and recruitment of a Youth Centre Manager role that we would like to move forward with in partnership with the Council over the forthcoming months.

Coding Club

We have successfully developed a five week program for local children to participate in, which offers a range of exposure to computer coding. With the support of a local IT entrepreneur and some enthusiastic parents this is the first of, hopefully, many programs that we can offer to the local community. There are currently 17 children booked onto the program, which started on the 22nd April, with three supporting 'coders', two parent helpers and an enthusiastic teenager who is keen to both learn and support his fellow enthusiasts.

The hardware being utilized was kindly offered by the Trainer to help identify the needs of the club and following the first successful program of events we (the Trust) will look to obtain modern, up to date equipment that can be available at the Youth Centre for all enthusiasts to use.

Chess Competition

There will be the opportunity for local children to participate in a Chess Competition / Tournament before the end of the school year. This is being hosted at the Youth Centre by members of the Trust and local enthusiasts as an opportunity for young people to engage in a positive competitive mental sporting activity. Depending on its success the Youth Centre would like to host at least one event a term or see if there is any desire for a Chess Club on a regular basis.

Management of the Youth Centre / Lead Youth Worker

In November 2016 we included in our outline the proposal for a Youth Centre Manager. We have over the last year worked hard to both recruit a Lead Youth Worker, with no positive result and to secure a significant amount of funding that would enable us to proceed with recruiting to both posts on a substantive basis.

We would like to attempt one last concerted effort to recruit to the Lead Youth Worker post and kick start the youth club and will over the next six weeks ensure that Vacancy posts are submitted in the following:

It is the view of the Trustee Board that if following the above substantive recruitment drive we are still unable to recruit to a Youth Worker Post we must look to an alternative solution to the continuing development and general running of the Youth Centre and to this extent we will approach the Parish Council at their July Meeting with a proposal for recruiting to a Youth Centre Manager post.

We would also at that time like to seek Parish Council support for moving forward with this option, on that basis we will table a more comprehensive financial proposal seeking renewed financial support from the Council in making this a more substantive role.

Changes at the Trust

Following the stepping down of our Chair Paul Joel in November 2016, the Trust appointed Mrs. Bonnie Twiss as Chair and Director to the Company, in addition to which a new Treasurer, Mr. Richard Fuller, was appointed and will be in place at the time of the Parish Council meeting in May.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended 31 July 2016

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRSSE) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (the FRSSE) (effective 1 January 2015)', the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective January 2015) and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.
