

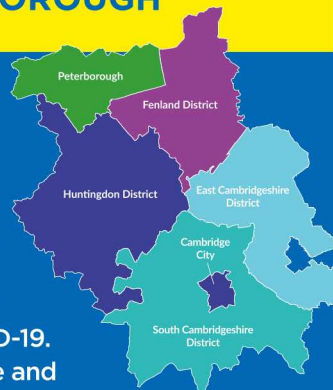

CAMBRIDGESHIRE AND PETERBOROUGH COVID-19 ALERT

COVID-19 RATES REMAIN HIGH ACROSS CAMBRIDGESHIRE AND PETERBOROUGH AND RATES ARE RISING.

This is causing pressure on our NHS, education and other vital services. All vaccinations approved in the UK are safe and we know there is growing evidence that the COVID-19 vaccines are effective at reducing hospitalisations and death from COVID-19. Vaccination rates in some parts of Cambridgeshire and Peterborough are lower than the England average and that is why we have this local push to increase vaccination rates.



I would like to urge you to get your vaccinations, both COVID and flu, if you are eligible, as we know both vaccines save lives. Don't forget your booster dose, if you are eligible, as we are seeing that this does reduce risk even further. Getting your jabs will help to protect you, your loved ones and our vital services.

- Anyone aged 12 or over is able get their vaccine
- If your child is aged 12-15 you can now book your child's vaccination appointment online via www.nhs.uk/covidvaccine or by calling 119
